BEDERKA WINS MEN'S "TURBO CUP" SERIES INVITATIONAL AT SHELBY LANES

Matthew Bederka won the Metro Detroit USBC (MDUSBC) Men's Series Invitational event on Sunday with a 234-212 triumph over Carleton Chambers of Detroit. This is a back to back win for Bederka as he won the previous event at Century Bowl in April. Bederka took home the top prize of \$500, while Chambers earned \$250.

Bederka qualified fourth with 940 on games of 202, 236, 277 and 225. In the stepladder finals he beat Lonnie Olsen of Macomb 242-234 in the first match. Olsen cashed for \$100. In his second match, Bederka beat the second-place qualifier Dylin Hunter of Windsor 230-226 and advanced to the finals. Hunter cashed for \$150.

Chambers was the top qualifier in the invitational field with a four-game total of 977 on games of 236, 256, 247 and 238 to advance to the stepladder finals and wait for the challenger.

The invited bowlers qualified for the Invitational at Shelby Lanes based on the points earned during the five-event series, winning at least one event during the season or bowling every in every event.

After the competition, the event participants were awarded their checks during a luncheon.

Bederka earned \$600 as the season champion with 803 points over the Men's Turbo Cup five-event series, followed by Jarin Kurashige of Warren with 728 points for \$300 and Nathan Roberts of Allen Park with 718 points for \$200.
