## **ANNA MAXWELL WINS WOMEN'S "TURBO CUP" SERIES INVITATIONAL AT SHELBY LANES**

Anna Maxwell of Westland won the Metro Detroit USBC (MDUSBC) Women's Series Invitational event on Sunday with a 263-200 triumph over Jessica Leduc of St. Clair Shores. Maxwell took home the top prize of \$600, while Leduc earned \$300.

Maxwell qualified third in the invitational field of 10 with a four-game total of 853 on games of 196, 216, 205 and 236. In advancing to the final match of the stepladder showdown, Maxwell beat Bailey Gipson of Davison 299-265 and Victoria Giardina of Shelby Twp. 245-222. Gipson finished fourth and earned \$100 while Giardina finished third for \$150.

Leduc was the top qualifier with a four-game total of 884 including games of 256, 183, 236 and 209. In being the top qualifier for the stepladder finals, Leduc had secured a position in the final match.

Bowlers qualified for the Invitational portion of the season long typically five-event series by finishing in the top 16 cumulative cup point list, winning a single event throughout the season or bowling in all five events. However, this season the second event was cancelled due to a power outage and not rescheduled.

After the competition, the event participants were awarded their checks during a luncheon.

Maxwell earned \$600 for winning the Women's Turbo Cup with 700 points over the four-event series, followed by Giardina with 697 points for \$300 and Brandie Reamy-Johnson of Taylor with 643 points for \$200.
