SOPHIA STREET AND ANDREW FSADNI WIN THE MDUSBC JUNIOR MASTERS TITLES AT PLAZA LANES

Sophia Street of Livonia prevailed in the girl's division and Andrew Fsadni of Canton, won the boy's division of the Metro Detroit USBC Junior Masters at Plaza Lanes in Plymouth.

Street qualified fourth with a six-game total of 1,212 and a high game of 226. In the first round of the stepladder competition. Street defeated third seed Jacey Thibodeau of Warren 265-193 then second seed, Maggie Smith of Ypsilanti 257-247. In the final match, Street defeated Ava Mazza of Shelby Twp. 245-215.

Fsadni qualified first with a six-game total of 1,472 on games of 250, 196, 258, 246, 243 and 279. In being the top seed of the stepladder finals, he only had one match against third seed, Hunter Wyszynski of New Boston and won, 240-199.

Wyszynski qualified third with a six-game total of 1,350 and a high game of 265. To reach the finals against Fsadni, he defeated Gavin Tank of Canton 222-219 and Ryan Carmichael of South Bend, 277-236.

Mazza, the girl's top seed bowled a six-game total of 1,292 including games of 172, 196, 201, 218, 279 and 226.

The event was a USBC Junior Gold qualifying event. The top finishers not already qualified and earning a spot in this summer's event in Minneapolis were Jaysa Taylor of Detroit for the girls and in the boys division, Hunter Allen of Macomb as well as Darvin Goldsmith of Farmington Hills.

A total of 84 youth bowlers participated in this scratch event including 63 boys and 21 girls.
