### **TERENCE DOCKERY WINS \$1,500 FIRST PRIZE IN MDUSBC SUPER SENIOR MASTERS AT 10 PINS OF TRENTON**

Terence Dockery of Fraser won the MDUSBC Super Senior Masters title and the top prize of \$1,500 at Ten Pins of Trenton with a 235-215 win over Gerald Sikora of Ecorse. Sikora earned \$750.

Dockery qualified 15th with a five-game total of 1,174 including a high game of 278. He worked his way through the Winner's bracket of the two-game elimination match play format with victories over Larry Walker of Garden City 248-225, Larry Salvati of Mississauga, Ont. 214-207, his first win over Sikora 275-258 and Craig Poremba of Westland 237-228. In going undefeated throughout the Winners Bracket, Dockery bowled a total of 10 games over the two days with an average game of 238.30.

Sikora qualified 11th with a five-game total of 1,190 and a high game of 279. Prior to the final match with Dockery, he remained in the winner's bracket with victories over Ronald Burgess of Westland 236-220 and Joseph Buffa of Macomb. 279-206. After losing the next round to Dockery 275-258, Sikora went on to defeat Joseph Krajenke of Clinton Twp. 249-215, high seed Kenneth Wyatt of Sterling Heights 228-218 and Poremba 227-187. In returning to the final round against Dockery with one loss, the tournament concluded after Sikora lost the first rematch game against him. Sikora averaged 240.17 for 12 games.

Poremba finished third for \$700 and Wyatt finished fourth for \$650.

Poremba qualified fourth with 1,260 and a high game of 277. In the winner's bracket, Poremba beat Edwin Austreng of Waterford 233-173, Krajenke 255-206 and Wyatt 259-223. He then lost first to Dockery and then Sikora. Poremba averaged 242.20 over 10 games.

Wyatt qualified first with 1,330 and a high game of 269. He won his first two matches over defending champion, Bruce Wright of Warren 300-236 and then Richard Wayne of Westland 236-224. After his first loss to Poremba, Wyatt defeated Jesse Bowersock of Ann Arbor 257-

193 and then was eliminated in his next match against Sikora. Wyatt averaged 256.40 for 10 games.

Two perfect 300 games were rolled during the tournament. The first one was rolled by Wayne in Game 2 of the qualifying round and then by Wyatt in the first round of Match Play against Wright.

The top seven Super Super Seniors, ages 70 and older, who did not qualify for match play each earned \$110. The top seven included: Charles Richardson Jr. of Southfield (1,154), Richard Toswell of Wyandotte (1,148), Gregory Cohen of Livonia (1,143), Rick Capaldi of Manitou Beach (1,143), Mark Hatchigian of Novi (1,119), Anthony Stipcak Jr. of Redford (1,117) and Peter Minaudo of Chesterfield (1,086).
