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SAMUELS, GIARDINA, LANG AND LAMBERT-CONANT CAPTAIN MDUSBC ALL-CITY TEAMS

The Metro Detroit USBC Association (MDUSBC) has named their All-City teams for the 2025-26 season. MDUSBC is the largest local association of the United States Bowling Congress with over 30,000 adult and youth members.

The teams include men's, women's, senior men's and senior women's teams based on tournament and league performance from August 1, 2025 through July 31, 2026. A complete list of criteria is available at www.mdusbc.com. Points are tabulated on performance in local, state and national tournaments, honor scores and league averages. Members must be 50 years or older on August 1, 2025 to be eligible for the senior team.

Noah Samuels of Canton captains the men's team while Victoria Giardina of Shelby Twp., Jay Lang of Sterling Heights and Lesia Lambert of Allen Park captain the women's, senior men's and senior women's teams respectively.

Men's All-City Teams:

Samuels earned 101 points with a first-place finish in the MDUSBC Masters Championship and the following finishes in the MDUSBC Men's "Turbo Cup" Series event: first, second and fourth. In addition, he is the "Turbo Cup" Champion winning the most event points throughout the series. In league play, Samuels bowled seven 300 games, two 800 series over 825 as well as two additional lower 800 series. During league play, Samuels had a high average of 244. This marks the first appearance for Samuel's on the All-City Team.

Rounding out the Men's first team are AJ Rice II of Holly (90), Jacob Johnson of Redford (79), Charles Zelechowski of Westland (67) and John Kelley of Clinton Twp. (65)

Rice was the top finisher from MDUSBC in the USBC Open Championship in both Singles and All-Events. In league play, Rice bowled 13 – 300 games, five series over 825, three additional lower 800 series and had a high average of 258. This marks the first appearance for Rice on the All-City Team.

Johnson finished fourth in the MDUSBC Open Championship Doubles with his father Craig Johnson, third from MDUSBC in the Michigan State USBC (MSUSBC) Open Tournament Doubles with William Mihalyfi as well as second from MDUSBC in All Events. Johnson earned additional bonus points as the third overall finisher in All-Events at the MSUSBC Open Tournament. In league play, Johnson had four 300 games, two series over 800 and a high average of 232. This marks the first appearance for Johnson on the All-City Team.

Zelechowski finished 17th in the MDUSBC Masters Championship and at the MSUSBC Open Tournament finished fifth from MDUSBC in Singles as well as third in All-Events. In league play, Zelechowski bowled seven 300 games, one series over 825 as well as 2 lower 800 series. In addition, he had a high average of 235. This marks the first appearance for Zelechowski on the All-City First Team.

Kelley finished sixth in Doubles with Ryan VanHecke at the MDUSBC Open Championship. In league play, he had four 300 games, two series over 825 and five lower 800 series. In addition, Kelley had a high average of 244. This marks the 11th appearance for Kelley on the All-City Team.

Kevin Jonca of Canton (60), Ryan Nelson of Roseville (60), Michael Calhoun of Wyandotte (59), Devon Osborn of Farmington Hills (58), Daniel Jordan of Westland (57) and Jay Lang of Sterling Heights (57) made the Men's All-City Second Team. This marks the first appearance for Jonca, Nelson, Osborn and Jordan on the All-City Team. It is the third appearance for Calhoun and the 10th for Lang.

Women's All-City Teams:

Giardina earned 124 points with winning the MDUSBC Queens Championship and two second places in the MDUSBC Women's "Turbo Cup" Series events. In the MDUSBC Women's Championship, she finished fourth in both Doubles with Lindsey McLeod and in All-Events. In the MSUSBC Women's Tournament, she finished second over all in Doubles with Bailey Gipson earning both finishing and bonus points as well as being second from MDUSBC in both Singles and All-Events. In league play, Giardina had one 300 game, two 279 plus games, two 800 series, ten 700 series and a high average of 232. This marks the third appearance for Giardina on the Women's All-City Team.

Rounding out the Women's second team are Brandie Reamy-Johnson of Taylor (96), Nicole Wilson of South Lyon (80), Bailey Gipson of Davison (68) and Anna Maxwell of Westland (62).

Reamy-Johnson earned points in all divisions of the MDUSBC Women's Championship including a first-place finish in Singles, second place in Doubles with Nicole Wilson and seventh in All-Events. In the MSUSBC Women's Tournament, she finished third from MDUSBC in Doubles with Ashley Denard, first from MDUSBC in All-Events as well as earning bonus points as the second overall finisher. Additional tournament finishes include fifth from MDUSBC in the MSUSBC Queens Championship and one fourth place finish in the Women's "Turbo Cup" Series events. In league play, she had three 279 plus games, seven 700 series and a high average of 224. This marks the eighth appearance from Reamy-Johnson on the Women's All-City Team.

Wilson earned points in the MDUSBC Women's Championship with a second-place finish in Doubles with Reamy-Johnson as well as being the All-Events Champion. In MSUSBC events, Wilson finished second from MDUSBC in the Queens Championship as well as eighth in Doubles at the Women's Tournament. In league play, Wilson had one 300 game, three 279 plus games, eleven 700 series and a high average of 226. This marks the third appearance for Wilson on the Women's All-City Team.

Gipson earned points in the MDUSBC Women's Championship with a third-place finish in Doubles with Sandra Schultz and fifth in All-Events. In Queens Championships, Gipson finish 13th at MDUSBC and third from MDUSBC at the MSUSBC event. In the MSUSBC Women's Tournament, she finished second overall in Doubles with Victoria Giardina earning both finishing and bonus points. In league play, Gipson bowled two 299 games, two 700 Series and had a high average of 211. This marks the first appearance for Gipson on the Women's All-City Team.

Maxwell earned points with two 1st place finishes as well as being the "Turbo Cup" Champion in the MDUSBC Women's "Turbo Cup" Series events. In addition, she finished seventh at the MDUSBC Queens Championship and first from MDUSBC as well as third overall at the MSUSBC Queens Championship. In addition, Maxwell bowled one 299 game, one 800 series and had a high average of 220. This marks the first appearance for Maxwell on the Women's All-City Team.

Sandra Schultz of Macomb (60), Sekeithia Walters-Wrights of Eastpointe (59), Lesia Lambert-Conant of Allen Park (51), Ashley Denard of Southfield (50) and Denisyha Waller of Shelby Twp., made the Women's All-City Second Team. This marks the first appearances for Walters-Wright and Maxwell on the All-City Team. This marks the 14th appearance for Schultz, the eighth for Denard and the third for Lambert-Conant and Waller on the Women's All-City Team.

Senior Men's All-City Teams:

Lang, 69 points, makes his second appearance on the Senior Men's All-City Team. In Senior finishes, Lang finished first in the MDUSBC Doubles event with Perry Crowell IV and eighth in Singles. At the USBC Open Championship, Lang finished second as Senior from MDUSBC. In league play, Lang has three 300 games, one 299 game, one 800 series and a high average of 234.

Rounding out the Senior Men's All-City Team are Terence Dockery of Fraser (53), Eric Tulley of Brighton (51), Gerald Sikora of Ecorse (51) and Scott Bowersock of Dearborn Heights (48).

Dockery earned points as the second highest Senior in Singles at the MDUSBC Open Championship and second highest Senior from MDUSBC in Doubles with Frank Robinson III at the MSUSBC Open Tournament. In league play, Dockery had two 300 games and a high average of 232.

Tulley earned points as the third highest Senior in Singles at the MDUSBC Open Championship as well as finishing 20th in the MDUSBC Senior Masters Championship. In league play, Tulley bowled three 300 games, two lower 800 series and had a high average of 233. This marks the first appearance for Tulley on the Senior Men's All-City Team.

Sikora was the fourth highest Senior finisher at the MDUSBC Masters Championship. In league play, Sikora had five 300 games, one series over 825, one lower 800 series and a high average of 226. This marks the fourth appearance for Sikora on the Senior Men's All-City Team.

Bowersock finished eighth as a Senior in Doubles with Edward Mintz and second as a Senior in All-Events at the MDUSBC Championship. In league play, Bowersock bowled one 300 game, one 299 game, two 800 series and had a high average of 235. This is the second appearance of Bowersock on the Senior Men's All-City Team.

Kenneth Wyatt of Sterling Heights (41), Randy Warnken of Clinton Twp. (41), Carl Harden of Livonia (40), Darren Becton of Westland (40) and Gerald Johnson of Taylor (39) made the Senior Men's All-City Team. This marks the 14th appearance for Wyatt, the first for Warnken and Becton, the second for Harden and the eighth for Johnson on the Senior Men's All-City Second Team.

Senior Women's All-City Teams:

Lambert-Conant, 99 points, had the following finishes as a Senior at the MDUSBC Women's Championship: first in Doubles with Cyndi Patterson, eighth in Singles and first in All-Events. She won the MDUSBC Senior Queens Championship and placed second as a Senior in the MDUSBC Queens Championship. At the MSUSBC Women's Tournament, Lambert-Conant as a Senior from MDUSBC finished sixth in Doubles with Cyndi Patterson as well as fifth in both Singles and All-Events. In league play, she had one 299 game, one 279 game, seven 700 series and a high average of 220. This marks the third appearance for Lambert on the Senior Women's All-City Team.

Rounding out the Senior Women's All-City Team are Sandra Schultz of Macomb (86), Sekeithia Walters-Wright of Eastpointe (83.5), Michelle Berryman of Brighton (62.5) and Tempel Johnson of Southfield (58). Schultz finished in the following places as a Senior at the MDUSBC Women's Championship: second in Doubles with Bailey Gipson, fourth in Singles and fourth in All-Events. She finished seventh at the MDUSBC Senior Queens and first as a Senior in the MDUSBC Queens Championships. In addition, Schultz had one 4th place finish in the MDUSBC Women's "Turbo Cup" Series. In league play, Schultz had two 300 games, three 299 games, two additional games over 279, one 800 series, seven 700 series and a high average of 214. This marks the 14th appearance for Schultz on Senior Women's All-City Team.

Walters-Wright finished in the following places as a Senior in the MDUSBC Women's Championship: fourth in Doubles with Tonya Wilson, tied for first in Singles and second in All-Events. She finished fourth in the MDUSBC Senior Queens and fourth as a Senior in the MDUSBC Queens Championships. In the MSUSBC Women's Tournament, Walters-Wright was the highest Senior from MDUSBC in Singles and second in All-Events. In league play, Walters-Wright bowled one 279 plus game, six 700 series and a high average of 203. This marks the first appearance for Walters-Wright on the Senior Women's All-City Team.

Berryman finished in the following places as a Senior in the MDUSBC Women's Championship: fifth in Doubles with Julie Halstead, tied for first in Singles and third in All-Events. She finished fifth in the MDUSBC Senior Queens and fifth as a Senior in the MDUSBC Queens Championships. In the MSUSBC Women's Tournament, she finished ninth as a Senior from MDUSBC in All-Events. In league play, Berryman bowled eight 700 series and a high average of 219. This marks the fourth appearance for Berryman on the Senior Women's All-City Team.

Johnson finished third as a Senior in Singles and 10th in All-Events at the MDUSBC Women's Championship. In addition, she finished eighth at the MDUSBC Senior Queens Championship. In the MSUSBC Women's Tournament she finished in the following places as a Senior from MDUSBC: third in Doubles with Deborah Funchess, third in Singles and first in All-Events. In league play, Johnson had three 700 series and a high average of 210. This marks the first appearance for Johnson on the Senior Women's All-City Team.

Cyndi Patterson of Taylor (53), Stacey Timmer of Wayland (52), Novella Daniels of Detroit (49), Julie Halstead of Redford (48) and Deborah Murrell of Shelby Twp. (45) made the Senior Women's All-City Second Team. This marks the first appearances for Patterson and Timmer, second for Daniels, third for Halstead and seventh for Murrell on the Senior team.
