STEVE KENYON WINS MDUSBC SENIOR MASTERS AND CLAIMS \$1,800 FIRST PRIZE AT INDIAN LANES

Steve Kenyon of Grosse Ile won the 32nd Annual Metro Detroit USBC Senior Masters Tournament in defeating two-time defending champion Troy Stus of South Lyon 473-451. In claiming the title, Kenyon was the lone survivor in the winner's bracket remaining undefeated until the first set of the final match and claimed the \$1,800 first prize. Stus earned the second place check of \$900.

Kenyon qualified 14th with a six-game total of 1,333 and a high game of 268. In match play, he defeated Peter Kaczmarczyk of Warren 504-454, Stacy Keith of New Boston 504-493, Phil Zocharski of Chelsea 469-446 and Stus in their first match, 501-457 to advance to the final match. In the final round, Kenyon lost the repeat match against Stus 501-424 before winning the deciding match of the two-game elimination format. Throughout the two days of competition, Kenyon averaged 233.78 for 18 games.

Stus was positioned ninth with his defending champion automatic ninth seed. In the qualifying round he finished with 1,280 and a high game of 263. In match play, he defeated Brad Gray of Farmington Hills 431-367, top qualifier Gerald Johnson of Taylor 506-493 and Gerald Sikora of Ecorse 415-343 before losing his first match against Kenyon. In the loser's bracket, he defeated Johnson in their second match of the day 473-465 setting up the rematch against Kenyon in the finals. Throughout the competition, Stus averaged 225.70 over 20 games.

Johnson was the top qualifier with 1,505 and a high game of 267. He first defeated Robert Sloma of Jenison 555-382 before losing to Stus in their first match. In the loser's bracket, he defeated Keith Engling of Highland 465-418, Kaczmarczyk 508-440, and Sikora 444-387 before losing the rematch against Stus. Johnson averaged 245.45 over 20 games earning \$700 for his third-place finish.

During the qualifying round, two perfect 300 games were rolled by Carl Harden of Livonia (first game) and Stephen Krywy of Warren (third game). In the first three games of match play, Zocharski bowled 262, 290 and 278 for an honor score series of 830.

The MDUSBC Masters Tournament is a USBC certified event operated by the Metro Detroit USBC, the largest local association of the United States Bowling Congress which serves over 32,000 adult and youth bowlers in the Metropolitan Detroit market.
